

Dean's Standard Student Welfare Charges 2018

	Breaches of College Regulations (health & safety)
Student Welfare Charge	Subject Matter
£15	Cycling on College Paths / Lawns (After being warned 3 times in a term)
£15	Cycles Locked / Left within College other than in allocated cycle racks (including Study Rooms)
£15	Wedging open doors of study rooms (one warning normally given)
£15	Smoking within the College Grounds other than at the two designated Smoking shelters (After being warned 3 times in a term)
£25	Smoking in Study Rooms or within College Buildings
£25	Tampering with Fire Protection Devices anywhere within the College
£25	Found using naked flames / heat within study rooms or within the College buildings (candles / incense sticks / portable heating / cooking devices)
£20	For Fire Wardens: Failing to complete the mandatory training at beginning of the academic year (14 days to complete) £15 recovered and £5 admin cost
Clean-up charge £80	Imposed additionally if Staff have to clean up students' vomit or other bodily exudation

Student Welfare Charge	Other infractions detrimental to the well-being of the College as a community of scholars NB: the penalties are more severe for the Quiet Period See separate notice
£15	Excessive noise after midnight
£20	Second offence for above
£25	Third offence for above (normally also seen by the Dean)
£25	Vandalism (including damage to college gardens); this is in addition to the cost of repair/replacement (normally also seen by the Dean)
£25	Theft of food from fellow students; this is in addition to the cost of replacement (normally also seen by the Dean)
£25+	Bringing the College into disrepute, eg drunken behaviour outside of College (normally also seen by the Dean) NB: Charges associated with drunken behaviour are normally levied at a rate of up to three times the estimated cost of the alcohol consumed
Up to £50+	Offensive/disrespectful behaviour of any kind towards any member of the College Community (normally also seen by the Dean)
Most other infractions would normally involve being seen by the Dean. Serious incidents, including those involving illegal drugs might also involve the police and other authorities.	

***In some cases, at the Dean's discretion, community service will be handed down, in addition to or instead of Student Welfare Charges**
