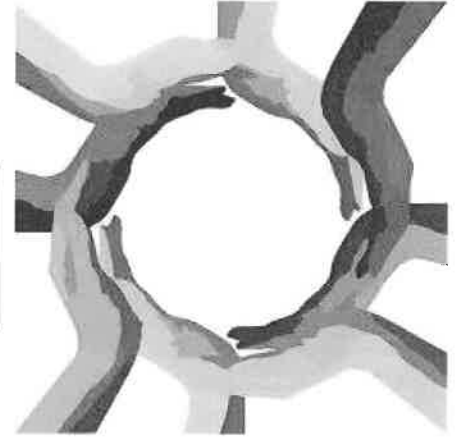


VOTE FOR AFOPE AS YOUR NEXT BME OFFICER!
